

LTC'S MINISTRY DISCOVERY PROCESS

- **A.** Attend CLASS 301: Discovering My Ministry (which is this class). In this class we're going to look at these five things: my Spiritual gift, my Heart, my Abilities, my Personality, my Experience -- what God made me to be.
- **B.** Complete your ministry profile. At the end of this book is a ministry profile for you to fill out. A copy will also be given to you. You'll do that at home.
- **C. Commit to and sign the ministry covenant.** At each of the discipleship classes (Classes 101 201) -- we have a membership covenant in 101, a Maturity Covenant in 201, and in this class we have the Ministry Covenant which is the covenant we'll be talking about tomorrow. It says I'm committing my self to using my talents and the way God shaped me in ministry.
- **D.** An interview. You're going to come in with your ministry profile and meet with a Ministry Guide. A Ministry Guide is a person in our church who's been trained, who understands both the ministries of the church and understands this process. He'll sit down and help you identify three or possibly four potential areas of service. We'll walk you through What is my gift, What is my ability, What is my heart, things like that. If we don't find something there that fits you, we'll create a new ministry for you. We'll find a place that best fits you. That's done in an interview.
- E. Then you meet with the staff who supervises the ministries you're considering.
- F. You begin your ministry and attend the leadership meetings.

We have leadership trainings for leaders to help advance their leadership skills and help mentor them on a regular basis. We will inform you of when and where the meetings are.

That's the process and that's where we're going.

IDENTIFYING MY UNIQUE S.H.A.P.E.

We've prepared and adapted several tools to help you discover and think through the five factors that make up who you are. You will complete these on your own (homework) before Session 4. Your Spiritual Gift" will give you an overview of spiritual gifts and help you identify which ones you may have been given by God. ______ Your Heartbeat" will help you clarify what you really love to ______ Your Abilities" will help you appreciate the natural talents and vocational skills you have. 4. "______Your Personality" will help you see how your God given temperament can best be used in ministry. 5. "______Your Experiences" will help you review your history to discover how God has prepared you for a unique ministry that only you can fulfill. Remember: 1. Have fun! These are not "tests"! There are no right or wrong answers. The purpose is to show how you are a unique blend! 2. Each one is self-evaluating. No one is "rating" you on this. We're interested in your feelings, not others. However, it may be helpful to ask for additional input from those closest to you after you've filled in your own responses. 3. The value of each of these tools will vary depending on your age, how long you've been a Christian, your background, your honesty, and how much time and serious thinking you're willing to invest in them! 4. As you complete each tool, transfer your results to the form called "My Ministry Profile". It's easier to discover your gift through ministry than to discover your ministry through your gift.

The Bible does not lock us into tight restrictions as to the number of spiritual gifts, or even their definitions. The four major lists of gifts are found in Romans 12:-8, 1 Cor. 12:1-11, 27-31, and Eph. 4:11-12, 1 Peter 4;9-11 but there are other passages that mention or illustrate gifts not included in these lists.

All gifts are given to help the church fulfill its purposes. So we've categorized this list of gifts according to **LTC's Five Purposes.**

As you read through this list, check off your initial impression concerning yourself. Remember you can have many gifts.

Gifts that Celebrate God's Presence (Worship)

(Worship or prayer-related gifts)

Music - Psalm 150

The ability to celebrate God's presence through music, either vocal or instrumental, and to led the church family in worship.

Arts & Crafts - Exodus 31:3-11

The ability to build, maintain, or beautify the place of worship for God's glory. The ability to express worship through a variety of art forms.

Gifts that Assimilate God's People (Fellowship)

Evangelism - Acts 8:26-40

The ability to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ to unbelievers in a positive, non-threatening way. The ability to sense opportunities to share Christ and lead people to respond with faith.

Missions - 1 Cor. 9:19-23, Acts 13:2-3

The ability to adapt to a different culture in order to reach unbelievers and help believers from that culture.

Hospitality - 1 Peter 4:9-10

The ability to make others, especially strangers, feel warmly welcomed, accepted, and comfortable in the church family. The ability to coordinate factors that promote fellowship

Gifts that Educate God's People (Discipleship)

Teaching - Eph. 4:12-13

The ability to educate God's people by clearly explaining and applying the Bible in a way that causes them to learn. The ability to equip and train other believers for ministry.

Encouragement - ("Exhortation") Acts 14:22

The ability to motivate God's people to apply and **act on** Biblical principles, especially when they are discouraged or wavering in their faith. The ability to bring out the best in others and challenge them to develop their potential.

Wisdom - 1 Cor. 2:1, 6-16

The ability to understand God's perspective on life situations and share those insights in a simple, understandable way. The ability to explain what to do and how to do it.

Discernment - 1 John 4:1-6

The ability to distinguish right from wrong, truth from error, and to give an immediate evaluation based on God's Word. The ability to discern whether the source of an experience is Satan, self, or God's Spirit

Knowledge - Daniel 1:17

The ability to discover, collect, analyze, and organize information that is vital to individual believers or the entire church family. The ability to comprehend a large amount of information and provide it when needed for effective decision-making.

* Speaking in tongues ("tongues/interpretation") - 1 Cor. 14:13-15
The ability to pray in a language understood only by God or one who is given the gift of interpretation at that time. (See note below on this gift).

NOTE ON SPEAKING IN TONGUES (1 COR. 14:13-15)

The ability to pray in a language understood only by God or one who is given the gift of interpretation at that time.

Why we do not allow this gift in our services

This gift caused such a problem in the Corinthian church; Paul had to write an entire chapter (1 Cor 14) of guidelines.

- 1. It is for personal edification, not for the whole church.
 - "Anyone who speaks in a tongue edifies themselves, but the one who prophesies edifies the church." 1 Cor. 14:4 (NIV)
- 2. We are to focus on building up others, not ourselves.
 - "Unless you speak intelligible words ... You will just be speaking into the air. Since you are eager for gifts of the Spirit, try to excel in those that build up the church." 1 Cor. 14:9 & 12 (NIV)
- 3. It confuses unbelievers in the service.
 - "So if the whole church comes together and everyone speaks in tongues, and inquirers or unbelievers come in, will they not say that you are out of your mind?" 1 Cor. 14:23 (NIV)
- 4. Ideally, it is not meant to be used in the worship service.

"But in the church I would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue. Brothers and sisters, stop thinking like children."

1 Cor. 14:19-20 (NIV)

"The gift of proclaiming God's message should be under the speaker's control, because God does not want us to be in disorder but in harmony and peace.." 1 Cor. 14:32-33 (GNT)

Gifts that Demonstrate God's Love (Ministry)

Service - Acts 6:1-7

The ability to recognize unmet needs in the church family, and take the initiative to provide practical assistance quickly, cheerfully, and without a need for recognition

Mercy - Luke 10:30-37

The ability to detect hurt and empathize with those who are suffering in the church family. The ability to provide compassionate and cheerful support to those experiencing distress, crisis, or pain.

Hospitality - 1 Peter 4:9-10

The ability to make others, especially strangers, feel warmly welcomed, accepted, and comfortable in the church family. The ability to coordinate factors that promote fellowship

Pastoring ("Shepherding") - 1 Peter 5:2-4

The ability to care for the spiritual needs of a group of believers and equip them for ministry. The ability to nurture a small group in spiritual growth and assume responsibility for their welfare.

Giving - 2 Cor. 8:1-7

The ability to generously contribute material resources and/or money beyond the 10% tithe so that the Body may grow and be strengthened. The ability to earn and manage money so it may be given to support the ministry of others.

Intercession - Col. 1:9-12

The ability to pray for the needs of others in the church family over extended periods of time on a regular basis. The ability to persist in prayer and not be discouraged until the answer arrives.

Healing - James 5:14-16

The ability to pray in faith specifically for people who need physical, emotional, or spiritual healing and see God answer. The ability to sense when God is prompting you to pray this kind of prayer.

Miracles - Mark 11:23-24

The ability to pray in faith specifically for God's supernatural intervention into an impossible situation and see God answer. The ability to sense when God is prompting you to pray this kind of prayer.

Gifts that Communicate God's Word (Missions)

(to both unbelievers and believers)

Preaching - ("Prophecy")1 Cor. 14:3

The ability to publicly communicate God's word in an inspired way that convinces unbeliever and both challenges and comforts believers. The ability to persuasively declare God's will.

Evangelism - Acts 8:26-40

The ability to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ to unbelievers in a positive, non-threatening way. The ability to sense opportunities to share Christ and lead people to respond with faith.

Missions - 1 Cor. 9:19-23, Acts 13:2-3

The ability to adapt to a different culture in order to reach unbelievers and help believers from that culture.

Apostle - Rom. 15:20

The ability to start new churches and oversee their development.

Intercession - Col. 1:9-12

The ability to pray for non-believers over an extended period of time on a regular basis. The ability to persist in prayer and not be discouraged until the answer arrives.

Healing - James 5:14-16

The ability to pray in faith specifically for people who need physical, emotional, or spiritual healing and see God answer. The ability to sense when God is prompting you to pray this kind of prayer.

Miracles - Mark 11:23-24

The ability to pray in faith specifically for God's supernatural intervention into an impossible situation and see God answer. The ability to sense when God is prompting you to pray this kind of prayer.

MONITORING YOUR HEARTBEAT

A. The Definition "HEART" (webster's online dictionary)

- 1. "A muscular organ . . . That by its rhythmic contraction acts as a force pump maintaining the circulation of blood"
- 2. "The emotional or moral mature" such as "love, affection, courage or enthusiam"
- 3. "Personality, disposition"

The Bible uses the term "heart" to represent the center of your motivation, desires, and inclinations.

"Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart." Ps. 37:4 (NASB)

B. What My Heart Determines

My heart determines . . .

• Why I say the things I do

"The mouth speaks what the heart is full of" Matt. 12:34 (GNT)

• Why I feel the way I do

"The Word of God... examines the thoughts and motives of the heart." Heb. 4:12 (Ph)

Why I act the way I do

"Guard your heart above all else, for it determines the course of your life." Prov. 4:23 (NLT)

Key: My heart is the real me!

Physiologically, each of us has a unique heartbeat. Each person has a slightly different pattern. Likewise, God has given each of us a unique emotional "heartbeat" that races when we encounter activities, subjects, or circumstances that interest us. We instinctively feel deeply about some things and not about others.

This God-given motivation serves as an internal guidance system for our lives. It determines what your interests are, and what will bring you the most satisfaction and fulfillment. It also motivates you to pursue certain activities, subjects, and environments.

C. Why has God Given each Person a Unique "Heartbeat"?

"God has put it into their hearts to accomplish his purpose..." Rev. 17:17 (NIV)

God had a purpose in giving you your inborn interests. In fact, your emotional heartbeat reveals a very important key to understanding God's design and intention for your life.

The Bible makes very clear that your heart was designed by God, but you make the choice to use it for good or evil, for selfish purposes or for service.

You may have...

"... selfish ambition in your hearts..." Jms. 3:14 (NIV)

Or you may...

"... Serve the Lord with all your heart." 1 Sam. 12:20 (NIV)

"... doing the will of God from your heart." Eph. 6:6 (NIV)

How can I do God's will and serve God's purpose?

By letting my heartbeat motivate me for *ministry!*

"It is quite true to say that a man who sets his heart on becoming a church leader has a laudable ambition." 1 Tim. 3:1 (Ph)

D. Taking a Spiritual EKG (Electrocardiogram)

If you are like most people, you have never taken time to sort out and identify the things you are good at and motivated to accomplish. As a result, it is unlikely that you use these talents as completely or effectively as you could. The key to understanding your heartbeat is to look at your past accomplishments.

This exercise is adapted from the book <u>Finding A Job You Can Love</u> by Ralph Mattson & Arthur Miller (Nelson, 1982). We *highly recommend* that you read this book!

Step 1: List and Describe Your Accomplishments Since Childhood

• "I put on plays for the neighborhood kids with costumes, props, etc. We transformed the shed in the back of our house into a fairyland with lighting effects, decorations and princesses."

- "I started a kool-aid stand in the fourth grade and expanded it into three different stands. It was fun and I made money!"
- "I had a job as a printer's assistant and developed a method of cutting stereotypes which was faster and more accurate."
- "I ran for president and won sometimes when I was in school."
- "I have always liked to build things. Before I got married, I completely rebuilt the little apartment I was living in."
- "I successfully led protest marches against toxic wastes in my hometown and got local tv coverage."
- "I set a goal to read fifteen books over the summer and I did."

What to Include:

- Accomplishments at home, school, work, etc.
- Things you **enjoyed** doing.
- Things you believe you did well.
- Give specific details about what you did.
- Forget what other people think about it.
- 1. Remember, you're recalling things you *enjoyed doing* and *did well* (accomplishments), not simply pleasant experiences

BAD EXAMPLE: Had a great vacation in Canada GOOD: Took some stunning photos during my vacation

- Design and develop -- I love to make something out of nothing. I enjoy getting something started from scratch.
- Pioneer -- I love to test out and try new concepts. I am not afraid to risk failure.
- Organize -- I love to bring order out of chaos. I enjoy organizing something that is already started.
- Operate / maintain -- I love to efficiently maintain some things that is already organized.
- Serve or help -- I love to assist others in their responsibility. I enjoy helping others succeed.
- Acquire and possess -- I love to shop, collect, or obtain things. I enjoy getting the highest
 quality for the best price.
- Excel -- I love to be the best and make my team the best. I enjoy setting and attaining the highest standard.
- Influence -- I love to convert people to my way of thinking. I enjoy shaping the attitudes and behaviors of others.
- Perform -- I love to be on stage and receive the attention of others. I enjoy being in the limelight.
- Improve -- I love to make things better. I enjoy taking something that someone else has designed or started and improve it.
- Repair -- I love to fix what is broken or change what is out of date.
- Lead and be in charge -- I love to lead the way, oversee and supervise. I enjoy determining how things will be done.
- Persevere -- I love to see things to completion. I enjoy persisting at something until it is finished.

- Follow the rules -- I love to operate by policies and procedures. I enjoy meeting the expectations of an organization or boss.
- Prevail -- I love to fight for what is right and oppose what is wrong. I enjoy overcoming
 injustice.

You should be able to support your choice with examples from your achievements.

Example: I feel the basic motivation God put in my heart is to "acquire/possess". My history demonstrates this:

- I purchased my first car at age 16.
- I've collected s collection of rare stamps.
- I've built up a large cash reserve
- I've acquired options on three properties.

APPLYING YOUR ABILITIES

"There are different abilities to perform service." 1 Cor. 12:6 (GNT)

"I (God) have filled him ... with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skills ..." Ex. 31:3 (NIV)

One of the most common excuses people give for not getting involved in ministry is, "I just don't have any abilities to offer." Nothing could be further from the truth. The key is *matching* your abilities with the right ministry!

A. Five Misconceptions about Abilities

(Skills and Talents)

- 1. MYTH: People aren't born with skills. All skills must be learned by experience. This simply is not true. There are a number of skills which seem to be inborn and develop very early in infancy. When people say, "He just seems to have a natural talent for it", it's probably true.
- 2. MYTH: Those skills which must be learned, are earned primarily in the classroom. Actually some of your most basic skills were learned at home, "in the street", or somewhere outside the classroom.
- 3. MYTH: If you have certain abilities, you will be very aware that you have them. Again, that is not true. You're probably using a number of talents or skills that you are not even aware of. You need some process of skill identification.
- 4. MYTH: Skills that I use at work are only usable in that environment. I couldn't use them in ministry. Hopefully, by the end of this class, you'll see the fallacy of that idea. Be creative.
- 5. MYTH: Most people only have a few abilities. The truth is that many national studies have proven that the average person possesses from five hundred to seven hundred different skills.

- Classifying ability: to systematize and file books, data, records and materials so they can be retrieved easily
- Public relations ability: to handle complaints and unhappy customers with care and courtesy
- Welcoming ability: to convey warmth, develop rapport, making others feel comfortable
- Composing ability: to write music or lyrics
- Landscaping ability: to do gardening and work with plants
- Decorating ability: to beautify a setting for a special event

The same things are true when we try to minister in areas that are not suited to our personality. God has wired your temperament in a unique way. This factor is very important in matching you to the right ministry.

EXAMINING YOUR EXPERIENCES

"And we know that in ALL things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Rom. 8:28 (NIV)

"(God)... Wonderfully comforts and strengthens us in our hardships and trials. And why does he do this? So when others are troubled, needing our sympathy and encouragement, we can pass on to them the same help and comfort God has given us!" 2 Cor. 1:3-4 (TLB)

LTC'S MINISTRY OPPORTUNITIES

See our Organizational Chart in the appendix. Our ministries are listed according to the five areas of our organizational chart, which is a reflection of our Discipleship Process (from CLASS 101 and 201).

Note: The following are just some of the "main" ministries that we have; they are not complete. If your ministry is not on this list, please ask your instructor or ministry guide.

Worship

- Ushers and Greeters: This team greet people as they enter the church, write down the names of guests and visitors, help people find seating in the sanctuary, and do the offering.
- Audio Technicians: This team makes sure that all the musical and sound equipments work and are ready for the worship services, and control the sound system during the worship services.
 They also record the sermons and on-stage activities.
- Video Technicians: This team works with the audio technicians to make sure that all the video

work in conjunction with the audio for our worship services. They also video tape the sermons and on-stage activities.

- Worship Team: This team is a group of dedicated muscians of who lead worship on Sunday worship services. They practice during the week in preparation for leading our Sunday's worship services.
- Media & Communications: In the area of worship, this ministry helps prepare internal and external communications, video and sermon messaging for the church's worship service and its Youtube channel and Facebook page.

Fellowship

- Life Group Leaders: These LGLs lead a group of 10 − 12 people (especially couples). They are responsible for leading Bible studies, making sure that the fellowship of the group is strong, visiting and praying for the needs of the group (i.e. sicknesses, hospital visits, birthday celebrations, etc.), leading the group in reaching out to the lost, and training new apprentice leaders to lead future life groups. They report to their zone leader.
- Community Leaders: Oversee Life Group Leaders, life groups, and members in their community.
 They must be able to do everything that the LGLs do (when needed and called upon by their
 Life Group Leaders). Their ministry includes the caring for LGLs and leading members' events
 and praying for members (when needed) in their community. They report to the Area Leader
 who oversee their community.
- Area Leaders: Oversee the Life Group Leaders, life groups, and members in their area. They
 must be able to do everything that the LGLs and Community Leaders do (when needed and
 called upon by their Life Group and Community Leaders). Their ministry includes caring, leading
 events, and praying for members when needed) in their area. They report to the fellowship
 pastor.

Discipleship

- Sunday School Teachers: This team is responsible for teaching our children's Sunday School
 classes on Sunday morning. We have various grade levels for that requires different sets of
 teaching and relational skills.
- Nursery Staff: This team is responsible for taking care of our babies, infants, and toddlers during worship services so that parents can concentrate on worshipping God and His Word.
- Senior Adults: The focus of this ministry is teaching seniors the Bible, songs, and doing fellowship and caring and praying for each other.
- Teachers and Trainers: Teachers and trainers are needed for specific discipleship classes such as *Growing in Christ, Lub Neej Tshiab Ntawm Tus Ntseeg, TEE*, etc. If you have the gift of teaching and would like to teach a specific class, you will need to be trained in that class and meet the requirements so that you can teach that class.

Ministry

• Care Ministry: This ministry team goes out and celebrates with those who celebrate God's blessings, pray for those who are sick at home and in hospitals and deliver those who are bound

by evil spirits. Their focus is the healing and deliverance ministry. They supplement the work of Zone Leaders as a specialized ministry for healing and deliverance.

- *Prayer Team:* This ministry prays for the needs of the whole church. They pray for the church's unity and protection. They intercede on behalf of the pastors, leaders, and members of the church.
- Youth Ministry: This is a huge ministry, almost like a church within a church. If you want to be involved in this, ask the youth pastor to find out how you can be involved.
- Single Adults Ministry: Same as the youth ministry. If you want to be involved in this, ask the single adults leader/pastor to find out how you can be involved.
- Celebrations Ministry: This ministry ministers to the two areas of weddings and funerals. For
 the weddings, they (acting as elders) help communicate and negotiate the weddings according
 to LTC's Wedding Policy. For funerals, they (acting as "tswjxwm") oversee the whole funeral
 according to LTC's Funeral Policy.
- Media & Communications: In the area of Ministry, this ministry does internal and external
 communications for the church. They take care of the the church's website and media
 recording, duplication, and distribution. They also aid in the design, collection, and distribution
 of the ministries' report forms and other publication needs.
- Information Technology (IT): This team takes care of the church's information technology needs. They set up and maintain office computers and printers, manage the church's servers, network, and security.

Missions

- Missions Team: This ministry exposes the church to the mission fields and its spiritual and
 physical needs. They hold annual conferences to promote the Great Commission fund. They
 also connect with missionaries overseas to find out their needs and encourage and direct the
 short-term missions trips to help minister to those needs.
- Benevolence Ministry: This ministry reaches out to the needy and minister to their physical needs. They pray for, receive goods, and distribute these goods to those who are needy.

- 5. Once a Staff Ministry Guide Has Placed You into a Ministry, BEGIN SERVING!
 - Test drive to find out which ministry fit you best.
 - Be willing to change if a ministry does not fit you.
 - We will do our best to help you find the ministry that fits your SHAPE the best.
- 6. Make It Your Goal to Find a Ministry that Fits Your SHAPE the BEST Within One Year and Serve in that Ministry Long-term.


